CSD 880	The request is to eliminate the prerequisite status of CSD 880-Clinical Proseminar prior to
	enrollment in CSD 883-Clinical Practicum.
	CSD 883 is the course associated with the clinical internships in which our MA students engage
	during the final four semesters of the 5-semester MA program. CSD 880 was historically
	required in the first semester to address professional practice issues and to inform the students
	of the accreditation requirements of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. While
	CSD 880 conveyed important programmatic information, it was not a rigorous academic course.
	In an improvement to the course sequence, CSD 880 has been moved from the first (i.e., Fall 1)
	semester to the middle (i.e., summer) semester to provide two benefits. First, this allows for a
	language development course to take its place in Fall 1 and to occur prior to the Spring 1 school-
	based internship, instead of providing it in Spring 1 concurrent to the internship. This course

Secondly, the summer placement of the CSD 880 Proseminar, following a semester of clinical training, provides a frame of reference to address professional practice issues and greater scholarly rigor). The important fundamental concepts that prepare students for success in the program and the basics regarding clinical certification requirements - that is, those previously presented in the Fall 1 version of CSD 880 - are now addressed in a required MA Program Professional Practice Workshop Series in Fall 1. These changes have proven beneficial to our clinical training outcomes and have well-received by students/alumni.

Movement for CSD 880 to no longer be a prerequisite for CSD 883. John Sherry made a formal motion and approves. Robert Kolt Seconds. Motion approved.

Jennifer Johnson – At-Large Steering Committee Jennifer attended the CAC meeting to share information about the At-Large Steering Committee and to discuss topics that we discuss to the committee.

The committee has an opportunity to shape our institution with new leadership. They asked to have meeting minutes from listening sessions posted. They are also working on improved communication within the university.

The ComArts faculty reps are Keith Hampton, Bree Holtz, Laleah Fernandez and Dave Ewoldsen. The most recent steering committee meeting included revisiting the terms to ensure both Fall and Spring semesters are equal length, worked with the presidential search committee to share notes from the listening session, adjusted the travel policy to provide assistance in emergency situations and adjusted campus dining hours.

The group discussed how faculty senate representatives report back to the college. This may be an agenda item for the next meeting.

College and Unit Bylaws Reviews

Last week the CAC subcommittees met for an in depth discussion dedicated to each department's bylaws and RPT documents. The meeting covered the Dean's discussion of collegiality and how it should be implemented in each unit and the role of bylaws in our processes. An annual review of bylaws may be useful as well as a bylaw committee to enable consistencies and knowledge sharing.

Josh Introne-The review of the bylaws is not a retooling, but the effort to communicate the bylaws to each unit. Codifying collegiality within the bylaws may not be the best route. Instead, a working document can be created that is referenced in the bylaw.

Ann Hoffman - Two years ago CAC reps that were sitting on university committees were trained. A session in August may be helpful to allow individuals in committee roles to obtain historical knowledge from the previous individual.

Laura Dilley - CAC has a role to foster training and knowledge share. This may be outside of a bylaw revision, but is an important part of the CAC committee. We may be able to add a faculty orientation in our processes that can be used as needed. We may change the CAC chair election to the spring before sessions end to allow the new chair to prepare during the summer and will allow each department to nominate reps earlier in the process. CSD discussed the role of the faculty inclusiveness committee. Collegiality and community norms can be included in the goals of the inclusiveness committee.

Roundtable:

CSD-Formed a committee to revisit the bylaws and discuss necessary changes.

COM-Bylaws are up to date.

JRN-Currently voting on bylaw changes. Community and culture is currently being voted on. MI-Up to date and a committee is looking at RPT documents. Working with Laura Athens to consider collegiality which may result in adjusting bylaws.

Advising-Collegiality is being considered.

ADPR-Still in process of reviewing bylaws.

Equity committee is still in process.

Discussed a potential role for Laura Athens. Please continue to provide input on the use of Laura Athens skills as a consideration to utilize her college wide. Discussed data collection using services similar to those provided by Laura to analyze Faculty and Staff and also consider graduate students focused on mentorship as a separate group.

	Courtney Venker – Expressed concern over consultant fatigue if two units are already working with Laura. Timing may be critical to ensure faculty buy in to this process.
