CASA volunteers, called Court Appointed Special Advocates, partner with the Court and child welfare agencies to ensure children receive needed services and placement in the most appropriate, safe, loving, permanent home.

CASA is referred to each new case under court jurisdiction and provides compassionate advocacy to approximately 100 children annually.

Education

Volunteers participate in a 5-week virtual class and observe court proceedings. They learn the necessary knowledge and skills to become effective advocates for children in the court system.

Advocacy

They achieve this by visiting their assigned child weekly, forming and maintaining a working knowledge of their situation, and appearing in court to advocate for their needs and preferences.
